Edwards, Morris Llewelyn	Guyana	Dr. Edwards has 15 years of increasing responsibility in the field of public health and development. He is the Programme Manager, of a Global Fund grant to the Pan Caribbean Partnership Against HIV/AIDS. He has served in the Ministry of Health, Guyana, as the National AIDS Programme Manager, Director Genito-Urinary Medicine Clinic and Government Medical Officer. Dr. Edwards has extensive research experience and publications.
