DESCRIPTION

TB and HIV programme managers are invited to share experiences and discuss factors such as civil society participation, donor harmonization, and political leadership within the two programmes that have facilitated or impeded their partnership. An output of this session will be to develop a list of action points which will be followed up in 2009 at the 40th Union Conference on Lung Health.
