

UN+ is a global group of United Nations staff who are living with HIV that was established in March 2005. The group is a part of United Nations Reform in action; it brings together HIV-positive staff working in the system from across the regions and agencies. The mission statement for the group reads:

**Uniting for Solidarity, equality and acceptance for people living with HIV within the UN system through awareness raising, policy change and advocacy.**

The overall objectives of the group are:

- To contribute to the development and/or improvement of existing policies on HIV among United Nations agencies
- To create a more enabling environment of all HIV-positive staff members, irrespective of the level of disclosure of their HIV status
- To create an organized and effective voice for people living with HIV within the United Nations system that challenges stigma and discrimination

UN+ members have agreed to focus on the following four key areas of advocacy and to produce position papers on them:

- Stigma and discrimination
- Travel and Mobility
- Confidentiality
- Health Insurance

In 2007 UN+ will be collaborating with other positive networks in these priority areas to add its voice to people living with HIV wanting to scale up the AIDS response. UN+ has set up an e-workspace for members as a mechanism for communication and discussion of issues.
